

Criteria and Guidelines for Scholarship References

Please use the following guidelines for writing scholarship references, should you be asked by students:

1. Short introduction explaining in what capacity you know the student: subject/pastoral; length of time et. and an overview of their credentials in respect to the position.
2. A personal assessment of the student's merits and why they would make a good student leader and representative: here you may supply an anecdote or more personal reflection on the student, accompanied by a level of your recommendation: strongly, whole-heartedly, unreservedly, (or a less euphoric nuance).
